System defaults to a "subject search"; to search by keyword, click on the "basic search" tab.

This is the primary scholarly database for work in classical studies; originally produced in French, the interface is now in English but article abstracts may be in English or French. "Full Text" search is actually a keyword search against titles, subject terms and abstracts.

Covers all aspects of medieval studies within the period 450 to 1500 for Europe, the Middle East and North Africa. Citations classified by date, subject and location.

Iter: gateway to the Renaissance. Future plans include a monographs bibliography and expanding coverage to the Middle Ages (400-1500).

English version of the revised edition complete only through "Pherusa" (in print) or "Proklesis" (online).
